Parents v Cadets

On the evening of 18 November we held the Parents v Cadets shoot which was won by the Parents.

My thanks to the parents who cooked the food (provided by the ATC Association) on the barbeque for the parents and cadets waiting to shoot.

Our first shoot for this year held on 19 March was very well attended with 44 cadets turning up. Warrant Officer Michael Campbell was the top cadet on the day with 47 out of a possible 75 and I was the overall top shot with 53.

I am hopeful that the cadets' shooting scores will increase as the year progresses and we have been allocated two more .22 rifles bringing us to 8 weapons which will enable us shorten the waiting times.

UNIFORMS

At present we are outfitting the new cadets with their uniforms. All cadets will be in uniform by the end of term.

All first year cadets have received a lesson on ironing and how to clean their shoes.

Cadets will be issued with a Record of Service Book which they are to have with them at any time they are in uniform.
